| How long we keep information | <p>We will hold records that contain your information for no longer than is necessary, as per the retention periods specified in our Records Retention and Disposal Schedule.</p> |
| Who we share information with | <p>Your information is shared with the Service Manager, Senior Managers, Directors, the Social Worker and approval panel.</p> <p>Our sister company in Northern Ireland provides us with back office support services and if required, your information may also be shared internally on a need to know basis with other support departments.</p> <p>Your information may be shared with external agencies for the purpose of fulfilling our legal, regulatory and contractual obligations.</p> <p>Positive Futures uses data processors who are responsible for processing your information on our behalf such as our archiving facility and our support planning software provider.</p> |
| Data protection rights | <p>Under data protection law, you have rights including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Right of access – you have the right to ask us for copies of your personal data Right to rectification – you have the right to ask us to rectify personal data you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete Right to erasure – you have the right to ask us to erase your personal data in certain circumstances Right to restrict processing – you have the right to ask us to restrict the |

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| | <p>processing of your personal data in certain circumstances</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Right to object to processing – you have the right to object to the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances • Right to data portability – you have the right to ask that we transfer the personal data you gave us to another organisation or to you in certain circumstances • Right to withdraw consent – when we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent <p>You don't usually need to pay a fee to exercise your rights. If you make a request we have one calendar month to respond to you.</p> <p>To make a data protection request please contact us using the contact details at the top of this privacy notice.</p> |
| <p>Transfers of personal data to any third countries or international organisations</p> | <p>Your data is not transferred to any third countries or international organisations</p> <p>As noted in the section titled “who we share information with” Positive Futures Northern Ireland provide back office support in relevant departments. On 28.06.21 the European Commission approved the flow of data from the EU (and EEA) to the UK. This is known as an Adequacy Decision and confirms that the EU has determined that UK data protection laws are robust enough to ensure the safe transfer of data.</p> |
