Where we get your personal information from	Positive Futures has a legitimate interest in processing information for volunteer recruitment, administration and management to assess your suitability as a volunteer, to support you to provide safe and effective support to the people we support and to ensure your safety for the duration of your placement. We collect your personal information from the following places:

How long we keep information	We will hold records that contain your information for no longer than is necessary, as per the retention periods specified in our Records Retention and Disposal Schedule.
Who we share information with	Your information is shared with the Volunteer Supervisor and the relevant service/department Manager as appropriate.
	Positive Futures use third parties (data processors) who are responsible for processing personal information on behalf of Positive Futures such as our training provider.
Data protection rights	<ul> <li>Under data protection law, you have rights including:</li> <li>Right of access – you have the right to ask us for copies of your personal data</li> <li>Right to rectification – you have the right to ask us to rectify personal data you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete</li> <li>Right to erasure – you have the right to ask us to erase your personal data in certain circumstances</li> </ul>



	<ul> <li>Right to restrict processing – you have the right to ask us to restrict the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances</li> <li>Right to object to processing – you have the right to object to the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances</li> <li>Right to data portability – you have the right to ask that we transfer the personal data you gave us to another organisation or to you in certain circumstances</li> <li>Right to withdraw consent – when we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent</li> <li>You don't usually need to pay a fee to exercise your rights. If you make a request we have one calendar month to respond to you.</li> </ul>
